*Moved by Vought that the clerk post notice of the action of the board in regard to ball playing in the street.

*Moved by Vought that **John Wood** be appointed one of the **Police Constables**—

*Moved by Plant that the Street Commissioner is instructed to take up the **crosswalk between Sutherland and Bishop** immediately, unless, the parties mentioned will pay the cost of said walk.

*Moved by Morse that the complaint of Patrick Lannan in regard to water running into his barn and yard is referred to the Street Committee and that the committee reports at the next meeting of the board.

*Moved by Van Buskirk that Geo. R. Hicks be allowed \$2.00 per night for services as police on July 3rd & 4th.

Highway, \$300 Contingent- Amendment carried.

*Street Commissioner to report to the Clerk about concerns of walks in need of repair.

*Stooks moved that 400 loads of gravel be drawn on the streets of the Village this year.

*Moved by Van Buskirk that the President ascertain the probable cost of moving the wall at Wiltsie's Warehouse back on a line with the street and filling in after the moving of the wall and report at the next meeting.

*Stooks moved that the Lamp Committee be instructed to make a contract for lighting the lamps for the ensuing year as in their judgment will be for the best interest of the village. (direct quote from the original meeting minutes.)

*Moved by Vought that the matter of gutter on **West side of Main Street** from in front of **Porter's Place, North to Roger's Market** be left to the Street Committee to do with as they think best.

Goss as **Trustee** and **Lockwood** as **Clerk** having failed to qualify, the offices were declared vacant. The others having qualified, the meeting was called to order by the old Clerk.

*On Motion the Clerk cast one ballot for **G.T. Vought as President**.

*On Motion the Clerk cast a ballot for **P.D. Carpenter as Trustee** to fill vacancy caused by the failure of Goss to qualify.

*Moved to proceed to ballot for Clerk to fill vacancy, caused by the failure of Lockwood to qualify, five ballots cast of which Geo. Morse received 3 and Frank Wiltsie 2. On

*Moved by Spiegel that the Lamp Committee be instructed to make a written contract to light the lamps for the ensuing year at the best advantage they can.

*Moved by Spiegel that the Clerk notify the following persons to build a **sidewalk** 4 feet wide of 1 ½ inch Pine Plank, 2 x 4 Pine or Oak stringers on the **North side of Locust St.** in front of their premises; Shearer, Austen, Boakes, trustees of the Pres. Church, Episcopal Church, and Union Free School.

*Tousey moved that the Clerk notify the **N.Y.C. & H.R.R. Co. to plank or pave between their tracks at crossing on Main St within 30 days from receiving notice of the same.**

Permission refused unless 2 rows of flagstone, 18 inches wide, be placed in the driveway.

*Motion passed that an engineer be employed to **survey and map the Village of**

Pittsford and Carpenter has appointed a committee to obtain estimate of same.

*Moved that the Street Committee be instructed to fill and straighten the street in front of Wiltsie's Warehouse and place the same grade bulk as the rest of the street. Carried.

*Moved by Carpenter that E.G. **Boughton** be **employed to make a survey of the Village of Pittsford showing street lines, water courses, bridges, profile of all streets with proper grades, benches - established at a cost not to exceed \$50.**

*Moved by Van Buskirk that the Street Committee be empowered to enter into contract with Mr. Boughton for the above work. Carried.

*Moved by Carpenter that James Armour (Harmor) be appointed a committee to put **lockup in shape for occupancy.** Carried.

*Moved by Carpenter that the sum of \$1050 be assessed on the Village of Pittsford as follows,

\$700 for **Highway fund**

\$350 for **Contingent fund**

*Moved that **Dr. P.D. Carpenter** be **Health Officer of the Board of Health** for the Village of Pittsford. Carried.

President "Thos Speigel" in the chair. Note: interesting that the name is not only in quotation marks, but is also misspelled.

*Paid bill of \$45.27 to Crump & Whitlock for lumber.

*Paid bill to C. Cleveland for drawing gravel for \$26.90.

*Petition presented from Freeholders for a new street from Croton Street to State Street and from Morning Side Park West to the new street. Tabled.

July 22, 1891 Vol. 1:63

President Speigel (Spiegel) in the chair.

Trustees present:

Carpenter, Tousey, Harmour (Harmor), Hutchinson, and Van Buskirk

Business:

*Bill of J.M. Wiltsie for labor and material furnished in construction of the wall for \$21.42 presented, paid.

*Bill of \$16.80 paid for labor on wall.

*Moved by Van Buskirk that the trustee inspect the sidewalks in the Village on Thursday, July 23, 1891.

* "Carpenter" called for the petition of **Freeholders** for a new street. (Note, it is not clear why the name Carpenter is in quotation marks.)

*Moved by Carpenter that the petition be refused on account that the Board does not think that that is the proper plan for a street. Carried.

*A petition, No. 2, was presented by the required number of Freeholders for a new street from Croton to Monroe St. and from Morning Side Park West to the proposed new street.

*Trustee Carpenter presented the following resolution. **Resolved**, that the **prayer** of the petitioners **be granted** and that the improvements must be made in accordance therewith. Carried.

*Carpenter moved that the **muting** of the Village Board for the hearing on complaints for and against the said improvements be held on the 14th day of August 1891 at 9am, carried.

July 31, 1891 Vol. 1:65

President Spiegel in the chair.

Trustees present: Harmor, Van Buskirk, Carpenter, and Hutchinson

Business:

*Moved by Carpenter that the Resolution offered by Carpenter at the last meeting be rescinded. Carried.

*A petition filed July 31, 1891 from J.M. Wiltsie and the required number of **Freeholders** as prescribed by law was presented, **praying** for a **new street from Croton Street to Monroe Street and from Morning Side Park to the proposed new street.**

*The following Resolution was offered by Van Buskirk:

Resolved that the improvements described in the petition of J.M. Wiltsie and other **Freeholders** filed July 31, 1891 must be made to wit, that a new street be opened from Croton Street to Monroe Street and that **Lincoln Ave. be extended** to and interceded with such proposed street in the manner and according to the specifications and descriptions set forth in said petition and which is referred to and made a part of this resolution and that this Board meet at the Town Hall on the 25th day of Aug. 1891 at 10am to hear any objections that may be made to the taking such land on making such improvements. And that the President of this Board be hereby directed to give the notices whereof required by law. 4 aye, 1 no (Harmor)

*The Bond of C.W. Richardson as collector with J.M. Wiltsie and G.A. Goss as sureties were (was) presented.

*The bills of John C. Stull for \$1.50 and George P Stoll for \$54.48 were paid.

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*Moved by Van Buskirk that the Clerk serve notice on J.M Wiltsie to build a new 5-foot sidewalk in front of his Warehouse within 30 days and that the walk be laid under the direction of the Street Committee.

*Moved by Hutchinson that the board inspect the sidewalks in the Village next Tuesday, Aug. 4th , 4pm. Carried.

Aug. 10, 1891 Vol. 1:67

*Bills of R. Evans, \$3 and R.M. Swinburne for **Village Charter** for \$24.75 were paid.

*Trustee Carpenter offered the following Resolution:

Resolved that Mr. J.M. Wiltsie be instructed to build his sidewalk with the inside on a line drawn from the inside corner of the cement walk “**at the hay scales**” to a point 3-feet West of the Red Warehouse and from there on a direct line to the walk on the East Side of the Canal Bridge and the Clerk serve the notice on him. Carried.

Resolved that at the expiration of the thirty days mentioned in the notices served on Canal Superintendent John Gunsaul and J. Wiltsie that the Street Commissioner be instructed to build the said sidewalks. Carried.

“The Village of Pittsford hereby authorizes and directs the **formation** of a **Fire Department** within the **corporate limits** of the said Village, to be composed of one or more companies, which shall be equipped as hereinafter provided.

Section 1. There shall be two Hose Companies, each composed of not less than ten, or more than 25, able-bodied men of suitable age.

Section 2. One Company shall be known as Pittsford Hose No.1; the other as Pittsford Hose No.2

Section 3. Each Company shall be equipped with one Hose Cart and Hose, together with the necessary Axes, Crow Bars, Ropes, Wrenches, Hooks, Ladders, Pail, etc., which shall be furnished by said Village.

Section 4.

1. The officers of the Department shall consist of one Chief Engineer and one Assistant Chief Engineer, who shall be nominated by the Department at the Annual Meeting, which shall be held each year on the first Tuesday evening in June, at 8 o'clock; Except that the officers of the pursuant Fire Organization shall hold office until said Annual Meeting.

2. The nominations shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees, who may either confirm the said nomination, or appoint some other suitable person or persons from the Department for said offices. These officers shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified.

3. The Chief Engineer, and in his absence, the Assistant Chief Engineer shall have charge of all property of the Department, and shall be responsible to the Village Board for the proper care of the same, and have general charge of the Fire Companies at all times, and direct the same.

Section 5. This shall be a volunteer Department, and shall be known as such, and all officers and men shall serve without pay.

Section 6. Each Company shall have one Foreman and one Assistant Foreman, who shall be elected by the members thereof, and are authorized to adopt By-Laws, Rules and Regulations not in conflict with the Laws of the Village, or in conflict with the Laws governing Fire Companies of the State of New York.”
